JUDGMENT

When this case was called for hearing, Counsellor Eugene L. Massaquoi of the JALAW Firm appeared for the appellants. Counsellor Lawrence Yeakula of the Liberty Law Firm appeared for the appellee.

Having carefully examined the facts contained in the records, listened to the arguments on both sides, and considered the evidence and the laws relevant thereto, it is hereby

NE ADJUDGED SUGHT

That the law extant regarding the cancellation of a lease agreement provides that cancellation can only be obtained where the lease has been obtained by fraud, misrepresentation or misinformation; otherwise, a lease agreement must specifically stipulate what would constitute a ground for cancellation; and

That the appellee having failed to prove fraud or misrepresentation by the appellants of any provision of the lease agreement, and the said agreement being silent as to an expressed ground for cancellation thereof, the mere allegation by the appellee that the stores constructed by the appellants did not meet the standard anticipated by the appellee is not tenable to warrant the cancellation of the lease agreement.

WHEREFORE AND IN VIEW OF THE FOREGOING, the final ruling of the Sixth Judicial Circuit, Civil Law Court, Montserrado County, is hereby reversed. The Clerk of this Court is ordered to send a mandate to the trial court, commanding the judge presiding therein to

resume jurisdiction over this case and give effect to this Judgment. Costs are ruled against the appellee. AND IT IS HEREBY SO ORDERED.
