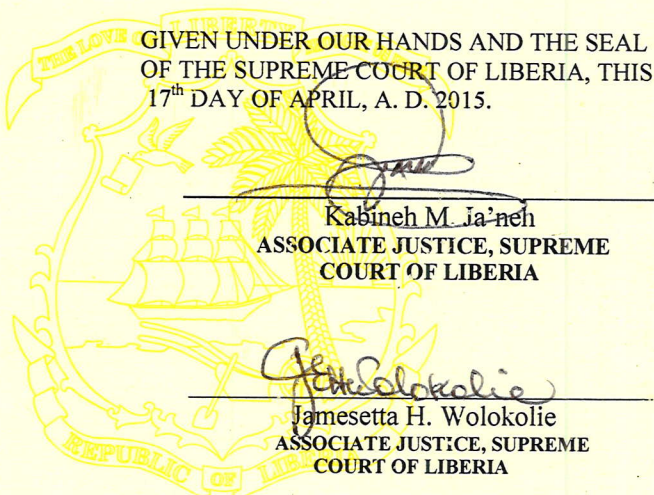


Having carefully examined the records, and listened to the arguments on both sides and considered the evidence and the laws relevant thereto, it is hereby


ADJUDGED:






