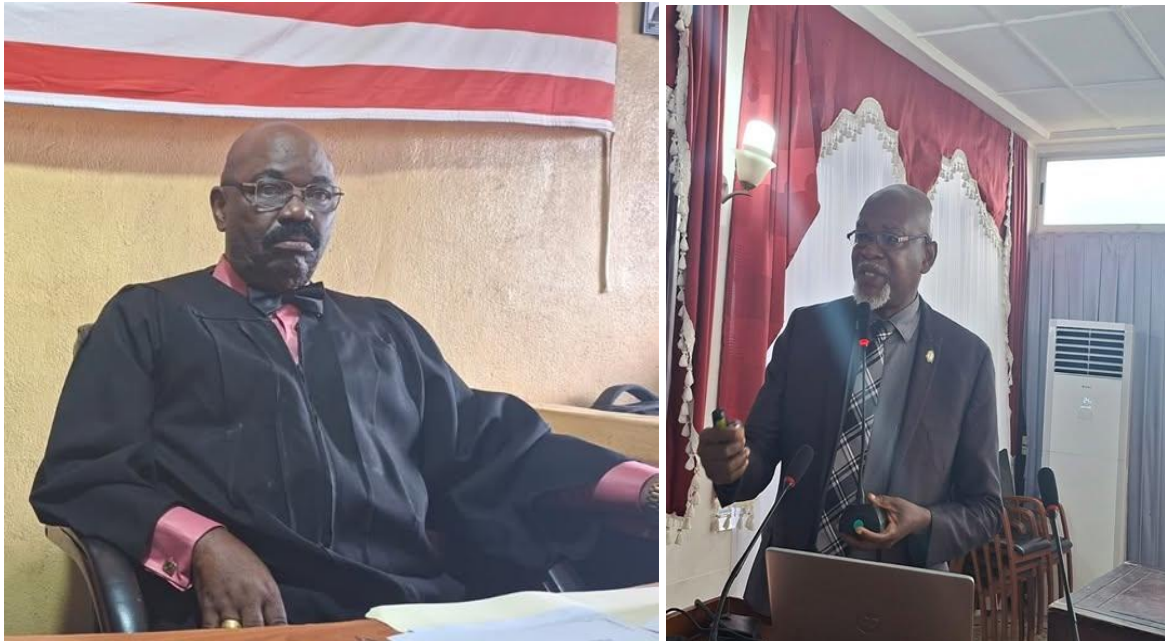




Jury Management Adheres To Judge Willie's Request

All is believed to be set forth by the office of the National Jury Manager, Cllr. Andrew N Nimley, as requested by Judge Roosevelt Z. Willie, to have Margibi County's first sequestered jury for the August term of court, AD 2026.

In the interest of justice and fair play, this is another move intended to boost the integrity of the Judiciary.

One of the major reforms on the top list of His Honor, Chief Justice Yamie Quiqui Gbeisay Sr., is building and transforming the Judiciary into an institution of integrity and making justice accessible to all Liberians.

The office of the National Jury Management, headed by Cllr. Andrew Nimley has taken major steps to work in line with the Chief Justice's vision. In response to Judge Willie's request, the Jury Manager has taken significant steps to ensure that Jury selection is underway in Margibi County.

Jurors will be selected, and a venue for their stay will be secured. Bailiffs and court security will be posted to ensure that the Judge's request is fully implemented, while daily meals will be prepared for the sequestered period.

It can be recalled that on Monday, August 10, 2026, at the formal opening of the August term of the 13th Judicial Circuit Court of Margibi County, Judge Willie explained that sequestration is necessary to safeguard jurors' impartiality. Citing Section 12 of the Jury Manual, he noted that while sequestration is rare, it is permitted to prevent jurors from being influenced by publicity, persuasion, threats, or bribes.
